A significant difference though is that there will be ***no interviews*** or any sort of in-person engagements. Applications will open June 19 at the **UOW Early Admission website** and will close August 11.

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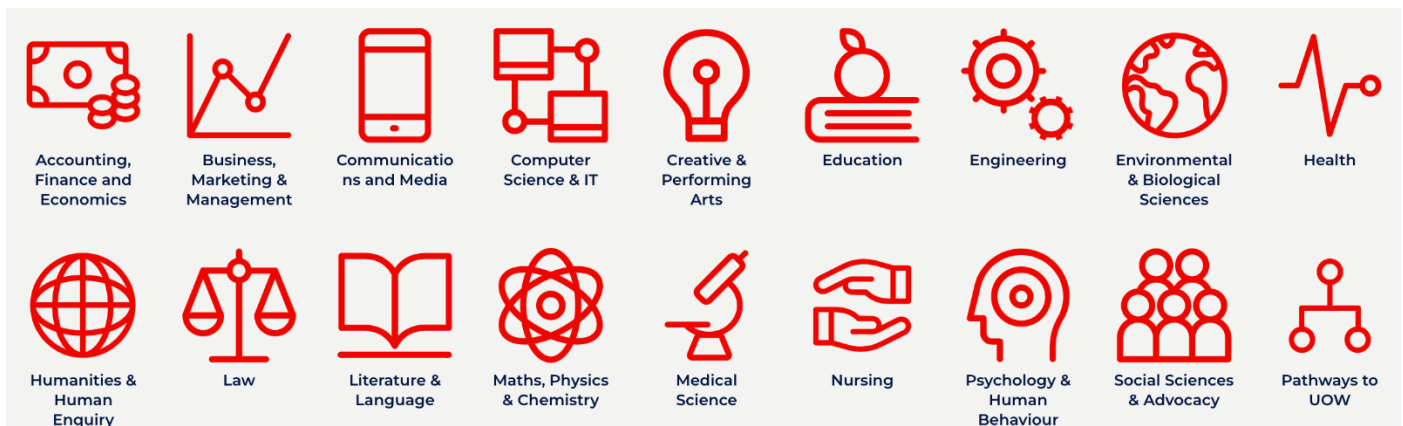

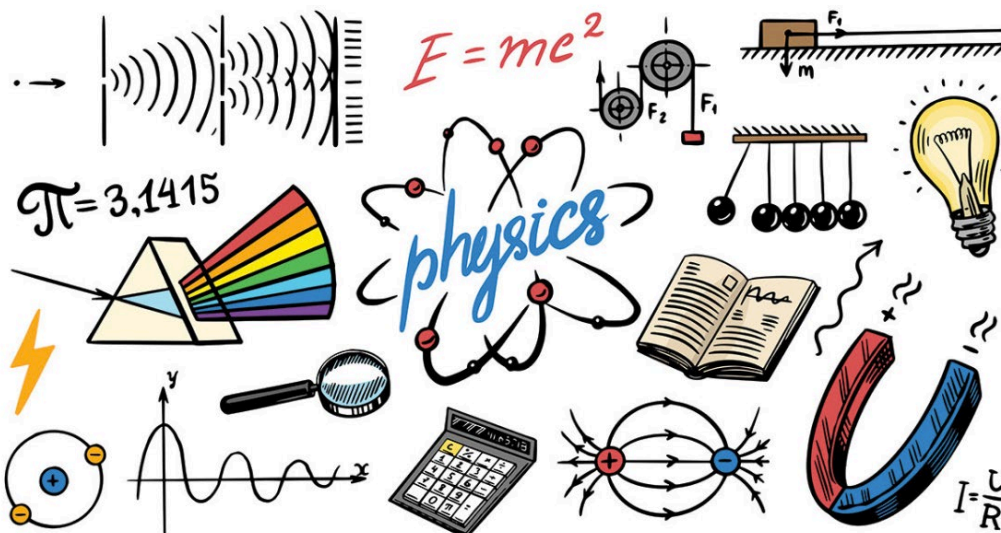

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Physics Careers are in high demand combined with careers in IT and Mathematics.



As the world adapts to climate change and employers adopt new technology like artificial intelligence, the job skills employers are looking for a shift in skills.

The World Economic Forum asked executives from 803 companies across 27 industries and 45 countries what skills they looked for in employees, and how they expected this to change over the next five years.

Analytical thinking and creative thinking, known as cognitive skills, remain the most important skills for workers in 2023.

Today, analytical thinking is on top, considered a core skill by more companies than any other skill. But looking to the future, creative thinking is reported to be the skill growing in importance the fastest, reflecting the increasing importance of complex problem-solving in the workplace.

A strong argument for sticking with maths in school can help children boost their cognitive ability!

Other important skills employers look for today include self-efficacy skills – resilience, flexibility and agility; motivation and self-awareness; and curiosity and lifelong learning.

All of these are seen as helpful for workers dealing with disruption from ongoing change.

Dependability and attention to detail and technological literacy rank sixth and seventh today, and then come the skills you need to work effectively with others: empathy and active listening and leadership and social influence.

Systems thinking, AI and big data, talent management, and service orientation and customer service are all job skills expected to become more important over the next five years.



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The jobs of the future won't be the jobs of the past

The job market is in for a big shift, with tens of millions of jobs expected to be eliminated and at the same time new jobs created in response to global trends in technology and the economy.

The fastest growing jobs of the future are expected to be:

- AI and machine learning specialists
- Sustainability specialists
- Business intelligence analysts
- Information security specialists

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UOW Early Admission 2023

Early Admission is UOW's early offer program. Students who are successful for Early Admission will receive their offer/s in **early September**, allowing them to focus on giving their best performance in their HSC exams, knowing they have a place waiting for them at UOW.

UOW's Early Admission program opens on **Monday 19th June at 9am** and close **Friday 11th August 5pm**. Students will apply directly via the UOW Early Admission portal www.uow.edu.au/early

As in previous years, students can apply for two degrees at UOW, and will be required to answer four questions about their unique skills and attributes which allow UOW faculty staff to assess them on UOW's Key indicators of success: Academic Readiness, Motivation & Passion, Planning & Persistence, and Communication & Collaboration.

These questions are:

- What are your study strategies when preparing for an important assessment task?
- What has influenced your decision to pursue your course or courses of interest?
- Describe a time when you worked with others to achieve a goal.
- Tell us about a time when you set yourself a goal and worked really hard to achieve a good result.

Students will no longer be required to attend an interview or compulsory online offer activation session. I do encourage students to attend the UOW Open Days to get all their course questions answered to assist with their decisions.

UAC News

Applications

A reminder that if students from NSW or ACT didn't receive their UAC PIN via email on 5 April, please have them contact UAC customer service line on 02 9752 0200 for assistance.

Schools Recommendation Scheme

At the end of April, UAC received 2000 SRS applications which is up by 18% at the same time last year.

And a reminder that schools won't be able to rate students until early to mid-August. UAC will be in touch soon to confirm the timing of this.

Early entry offer schemes

As you are all aware, there are many different early-entry applications, including [SRS](#), so here are a few tips for students.

- If students want to keep all opportunities open to them, then they should apply for both early entry as well as through UAC for ATAR-based offers.
- Don't duplicate preferences across applications.
- Keep track of all applications lodged.
- Early entry isn't a guarantee of entry, as students must meet the minimum entry requirements.



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- While the ATAR is still the main selection tool used by most unis, there are other ways for you to show that you're ready to succeed at tertiary study.
 - Many institutions have one or more early offer schemes for Year 12 students. Through these schemes, the institutions will assess you using criteria other than (or in addition to) your ATAR. Always check the institution websites to make sure the courses you are applying for are covered by the schemes.
